About the speakers

David Hanscom is an orthopedic spine surgeon who has been performing complex spinal surgery since 1986. David Elaimy is a performance coach for world class golfers and skiers. In 2007, they co-founded the “Awake at the Wound” seminar. It is a one-day seminar that systematically goes through the performance model. Over one hundred surgeons have participated in the seminar.

The basis of the seminar is the model that performance equals technical skill minus interference +/- luck. We assume that most, if not all surgeons, have a competent level of technical skill. However, they are not taught performance principles which are distinctly different from raw technical skills. Most surgeons instinctively acquire many of these performance skills over the time of their practice, but there may be a prolonged learning curve.

The Howard R. Ives, M.D., Lecture Fund, in memory of a Portland Physician and Maine Medical Center Surgeon, supports an endowed multidisciplinary lecture focusing on broad issues in healthcare. “My father was an individual whose life and practice embodied the principles of humanity, charity, chivalry, and honor,” said Rollin Ives, his son. “His dedication to his profession, his standards for professional excellence, and his love of his fellow man made him beloved in his relatively short lifetime. The lecture was established to honor both his memory and the standard of health care to which he was dedicated. Born in Portland on May 14, 1911, Dr. Ives attended city schools and went on to Williams College and Yale Medical School. He was a Senior Surgical Attending on the staffs at Maine Medical Center and Mercy Hospital, a member of the American College of Surgeons, and a Diplomate of the American Board of Surgery. His career was cut short by his untimely death in 1965.
